4	1842	Engraved dashed lines have been added to demarcate various geological zones in NC. Map is colored by geological zone, not by county. There are no updates to the political geography. The Finley imprint at bottom center has been erased. Multiple counties added: Cherokee, Yancy [sic], McDowell, Henderson, Cleveland, Caldwell, Catawba, Davie, Stanly, Union; many new towns and individual place names. Raleigh & Gaston and Wilmington & Weldon railroads. Map is colored by county; seemingly random curvilinear dashed lines represent the geological zones from State 4.
